
WHY DO WE MAKE SQUARE CORNERS?

You know that all floorwork outside the labyrinth is made with square corners. The square teaches us to square our actions. When the officers form the hollow square in the entrance march, it symbolizes squaring our morals of the day.

Here is something else interesting about the square. Think of where the elective officers sit in the chapter. If you draw a line between those eight stations, using square corners, you get a square/rectangle. This can be known as the "OES square; the ruling power." "It is outside the Star Points and the officers who form the square hold in their hands the harmony, peace and happiness as well as the good name of the chapter."
